A tidy town

The Deputy Clerk, Katherine Joy, recently celebrated 20 years of service to the Council. Councillors and Officers joined together to celebrate this remarkable achievement and Katherine was presented with vouchers, champagne and flowers in recognition of her dedicated service.

Green light for red box!

The Town Council has given the go ahead for the book exchange in Newfield Road telephone box to continue. This volunteer-led project had been granted a threemonth trial period in August. Thanks to a wonderfully supportive community, shelving was offered and installed by Fitz Costa's in Maidenhead, books were donated and a small local team – Alison, Natalie and Harri, checked stock and opened and closed the exchange each day. The Town Council, working in partnership with Community Payback individuals, tidied up the area around the telephone box and made improvements to the box itself. Since it opened its door the exchange has been hugely popular, with generous donations finding new homes. Our younger residents are particularly happy and

have found visiting the telephone box very exciting. Town Mayor Cllr Richard Scott, commented: "Another example of volunteers coming together for the benefit of the wider community". Going forward, plans are afoot to introduce local school children's artwork, a Facebook page and Book of the Week to encourage public engagement. Update on Town Council environmental initiative





Plan to 'Releaf Marlow' gets underway

An effort to get more trees planted in and around Marlow officially launched in November. 'Releaf Marlow' is a joint project between Marlow Town Council and local community group Transition Town Marlow. It has already drawn expressions of support from across the town.

The project has multiple environmental aims: to make Marlow an even more pleasant place to live, create more space for nature and absorb air pollution. Trees also take up carbon dioxide and provide shade in hot summers, helping to combat climate change.

Releaf Marlow volunteers are surveying the town's streets and open spaces to identify places where more trees could potentially fit. Across Marlow and Marlow Bottom there are nearly 300 public streets and spaces so the survey will take time to complete. The project is also engaging with Wycombe District Council, Bucks County Council (which owns the highways) and important private landowners like Red Kite Housing.

Following the survey, the project will aim to unlock additional funding for tree planting. This could include sponsorship of new trees by residents, who could also adopt a tree by promising to look after it for the first few years until it is established. The project has got off to a great start with a generous donation of $\mathfrak{L}1,000$ from the Marlow & District Wine Circle.

Releaf Marlow will also work with landowners and experts to secure permissions for tree planting. Where possible, community tree planting events will be prioritised, building on the good example of the community orchard planted in Seymour Park by Transition Town Marlow in 2014.

Councils act on town centre air quality
Marlow Town Council, along with Wycombe District
Council, is taking action on Marlow's town centre air
pollution problem, seeking to protect the health of

residents and visitors. New signage is helping to raise awareness of the issue with the aim of getting motorists to reduce their vehicles' toxic emissions. As in many urban centres across the country, Marlow town centre has high levels of nitrogen dioxide (NO2), an air pollutant mainly produced by internal combustion-engined vehicles. Annual average levels of NO2 are above the legal limit in central Marlow. As a result the whole of the town centre had to be declared an Air Quality Management Area in 2017.

Wycombe District Council reports annually on levels of NO2 and has published a plan for reducing them. Marlow Town Council joined the campaign in September, creating an advisory banner that now hangs regularly over Spittal Street. This asks motorists to be 'part of the solution not the pollution' by driving smoothly, avoiding hard acceleration, and switching engines off when stationary. In October, Wycombe District Council added its own signs at the perimeters of the Air Quality Management Area at the bottom of High Street, the western end of West Street and at Foxes Piece on Little Marlow Road. These signs alert drivers that they are entering an area of high pollution and encourage them to switch off engines when stopped.

Community group Transition Town Marlow has also been engaged in efforts to reduce Marlow's NO2 problem. The group has been working with Sainsbury's to get 'no idling' signage put up on the Riley Road entrance to the supermarket's main Marlow store, where drivers frequently wait for sometimes prolonged periods with their engines running.

A n estimated four thousand people gathered around the War Memorial on The Causeway in Marlow on Sunday, 10th November for the Ceremony of Remembrance.

The Lord Lieutenant of Buckinghamshire, Sir Henry Aubrey-Fletcher, took the Salute in the High Street and was accompanied by his wife, Lady Sarah.

Mr Benoit Burguad attended on behalf of Marly-le-Roi, Marlow's twin town. The Marlow Town Band played as well as the choir from All Saints' Church, who took part for the first time this year, led by Rhidian Jones, Assistant Director of Music.

Rev. Dave Bull led the prayers and Town Clerk Hilary Martin read Taking a Stand, a poem by John Bailey.

Mayor Richard Scott, Mayoress Linda Scott and Deputy Mayor Bob Johnson departed for Marly-le-Roi on Sunday afternoon to attend the French town's Remembrance Service held on Monday, 11th November. In pouring rain, the Mayor laid a wreath on behalf of all Marlow residents and read a short speech. In the evening, the party was invited to the private offices of Jean-Jacques Brot, the 'Préfet of the District of Yvelines' the representative of the French Government for that District located near the Palace of Versailles - a very rare honour.

Winter Gritter Parade

Transport for Buckinghamshire are winter-ready

n 5th October, Transport for Buckinghamshire (TfB) carried out its annual 'winter parade'. Each year, two weeks before the start of winter services, the drivers from all four highways depots take their winter gritting fleet out of Aylesbury, Gawcott, Amersham and High Wycombe on their usual gritting routes. This serves as refresher training for all 50 gritter drivers along with supervisors and staff who carry out the winter service. This is in addition to winter maintenance training, delivered to all drivers during the summer.

All vehicles have been thoroughly serviced and were inspected by the drivers to refamiliarise themselves with their machines. The gritters were then taken out on their routes so that any changes, such as route amendments, overhanging trees etc were noted and the team were able to ensure that all equipment on the vehicles is working correctly.

Once the parade was complete, the gritters were parked back in the depots in their winter service positions on call and

were ready to start from 14th October 2019.

Deputy Leader and Cabinet Member for Transport, Mark Shaw, said: "I am sure that some people in Buckinghamshire will have been surprised to see the fleet of gritters out so early in the year when it was mild! However, I am filled with confidence that the TfB teams and winter gritting crews are ready to go when they are needed from now onwards".

Once the road service temperature is forecast to drop

below +0.5°c and ice is expected to form for the first time this winter, the daily gritting decisions will be tweeted on Twitter **@tfbalerts** and shared on the website **www.buckscc.gov.uk/ services/transport-and-roads/road-maintenance-and-repairs/winter-maintenance**

Look out for five newly named gritters on the network this year including Salt and Vinegar, USS Enterplough, Sir Spreadmund Hilary, Roald Plough and Obi Wan Kesnowbi.





There's no need to worry, though - there are a number of ways that drivers can help themselves to continue driving safely. A good place to start is by completing the online e-learning module. The module contains lots of useful information from choosing a car, adaptions to help with mobility through to hazard perception training."





Marlow Rowing Club improvement project

In May, with the help of Brand Events, Pub In The Park and the celebrity chefs Tom Kerridge and Atul Kochhar, Marlow Rowing Club (MRC) launched Marlow RowAbility with the chefs' Boat Race.

Marlow RowAbility is a project to improve the safety, accessibility and appearance of the outside space at MRC and will cost in the region of £200,000. MRC have a growing number of club members with physical, visual and mental impairments, as well as many vulnerable members who all wish to get on and off the water with ease.

The project includes levelling surfaces and installing new piling and pontoons with articulated ramps so there is step-free access to the pontoons at all points. We are also planning to rebuild the Sculling Shed to the right of the club to give us more storage and easier access to boats, as well as making it more sympathetic to its natural surroundings.
