Thank you for your letter regarding the amended and additional information for the planning application 22/06443/FULEA: Marlow Film Studios

We fully support the original concepts to improve sustainable access to and around the Marlow Studios site and to promote and encourage active travel. And also welcome the additional investment in the land north of Spade Oak Lake and long-term commitment from the developers to transform a large area of monocultural arable land for biodiversity offset. We believe this has the potential to greatly enhance the adjacent proposed SANG area owned by Buckinghamshire Council for the benefit of the local community and general public.

In the past the Little Marlow Lakes Country Park Community Partnership and more recently Little Marlow Parish Council have proposed using part of this area for car parking facilities. We do believe this is now the wrong way to provide primary access to a local nature reserve, especially before more sustainable mass transit and active travel access has been considered or provided for. We need to encourage more sustainable, healthy and inclusive forms of travel around the local area.

The developers have affirmed that improvements to local active travel infrastructure can greatly benefit local residents as well as employees of the studios, but only insofar as the infrastructure provides safe, direct, connected and pleasant routes between homes, work, retail, education, leisure facilities and places of interest. Government research (DoT, 2015) has calculated an average economic benefit:cost ratio of 13:1 with walking and cycling projects, compared to an average of 2.5:1 with new motor vehicle roads.

Sadly, the additional cycle lane proposed in APPENDIX 1A - PS ADDENDUM - BNG OFFSET AREA (uploaded July 3rd) will not give a return of 13:1. We hope the council question the utility of this duplicated stretch of infrastructure, given that it will push cyclists and walkers back onto the A4155 at its narrowest section through Well End. In all submissions of this application active travel connections to Bourne End have hardly been mentioned. But the opportunity and value for residents (and potential employees of the studios) of creating a segregated and continuous active travel path between Marlow, Little Marlow and Bourne End centres and the Spade Oak SANG should not be underestimated.

The attached image suggests an upgraded sustainable access route to the SANG from Bourne End, with the direct connection to LMA 20/1 and Marlow. In the short term, a 5m width mixed use path should be created along the existing PRoW LMA 4/1. Linking Church Rd in Little Marlow, around Spade Oak Lake coming out at Coldmoorholme Lane, opposite

the Upper Thames Way junction. In the mid-term a crossing with modal filtered PRoW would need to be created through a strip of the sailing club 'parking area', along Sailing Club Rd through the Abbotsbrook estate and onto Wharf Lane and Bourne End town centre.

A more direct route away from the high-volume, fast-moving traffic of A4155 between Marlow and Bourne town centres will help establish a significant modal shift away from cars (helping with DoT target of 50% of local journeys being walked or cycled by 2050) for this relatively short journey, providing more mitigation for the impact of increased traffic from the Studios. This will also uphold Policy 13 of Buckinghamshire Local Transport Plan 4 (LTP4) - "We will support initiatives to help cycling become one of the most convenient and well used forms of transport for short journeys" and support LPT4, Policy 12 "Walking should be the best option for more short journeys."

We hope the council reject this new, proposed cycle lane from the developers in favour of a contribution towards the attached more-connected, safer and convenient, mixed-use path as a way of encouraging more sustainable travel around the site. It's proposed numerous 'hedgehog tunnels' are used under a raised path along the route around the lake for wildlife and flood mitigation purposes.

It's welcomed that the additional submissions have provided a more thorough audit of walking and cycling connections between Marlow and the Studio site. It's hoped that a condition of approval is the funding a Marlow LCWIP and, in due course, contribution towards the associated improvements to active travel connectivity that are identified. We have previously commented on the 'inhospitable' Toucan crossing and dual-carriageway roundabout design for the entrance to the Studios, this is compounded by the concern regarding the degree to which the A404 is a physical barrier to active travel between Marlow and the Studio site.

Only residents in the far north-west corner of Marlow are likely to favour the active travel route over the A404 and crossing past the new roundabout. The majority of Marlow residents, town centre visitors and most people coming from Little Marlow direction walking or cycling will prefer to avoid the A404 and A4155 completely. The additional documents recently submitted seem to acknowledge this and propose prioritising investment in either upgrading of the Volvo Bridge crossing to a wider ramped bridge that will accommodate cyclists and pedestrians safely or getting agreement from the landowner to the south to fund a new upgraded PRoW from Fieldhouse Lane.

The Fieldhouse Lane connection maybe of greater benefit for commuters travelling from the train station, industrial estate and residents from the south of Marlow. We hope an agreement can be reached with the 3rd party to complete this link. Further collaboration with the Globe Park BID for an ebike/scooter share scheme between the two areas will greatly increase potential for micro-mobility connectivity and therefore increase


commuting by train to the site.

A ramped bridge over the A404 and Parkway at the position of the current LMA20/1 PRoW, that cyclists can use without the need to dismount and is wide enough to safely share with pedestrians, should be the priority infrastructure constructed before the site is occupied. We advocate for BOTH an upgraded bridge and the Fieldhouse Lane PRoW link be constructed. We believe both would be needed to fulfil the desired modal shift away from single occupancy car use.

Finally, we would like to reiterate the long-term strategic value of active travel investment that this development could have for the district as a whole. An upgraded A404 bridge and associated infrastructure should eventually be part of a low motor traffic/traffic free east-west 'greenway' path across South Bucks; linking the Colne Valley, Black Park, Pinewood Studios, Burnham Beeches, Marlow Studios and the Chilterns AONB cycleway, boosting sustainable travel and tourism for the local area and county.





This enables, alongside habitat improvements made to the more southern parts of the development site, a 20% habitat improvement when scored using the government statutory biodiversity metric calculations.


