

I am writing to complain about the actions of Marlow Town Council in relation to the proposed film studio planning application.

As a resident of the Little Marlow Parish, I shall leave it to the Marlow Town residents to take up the issue of the letter submitted to the Bucks Council Planning Authority by Cllr Richard Scott and the appropriateness of how the decision to publicly support the above planning application was conducted. However I feel I must inform you of the anger and disappointment felt by many of the residents of Westhorpe Park, for the total lack of consideration and compassion by the members of Marlow Town Council, as we face such a devasting loss of quality of life, as a direct result of the project.

It is my understanding that Councillors have had multiple meetings with the representatives from Dido Property Ltd, despite refusing to engage with local residents who are the most knowledgeable and familiar with the area and people under threat. Sadly it appears MTC have been persuaded by the developers to believe the unsubstantiated claims, unachievable goals and hollow wish list promoted in the extensive PR campaign. The fact that the developers have

spent to much time and money on such an extensive PR campaign, just to try and convince people the project is a good idea, should in itself ring very loud alarm bells.

Whilst some Councillors believe the development my bring extra financial benefit for the local community, other than CIL and rates for the local authority, it would be highly unlikely to benefit the community, bringing traffic chaos, which we know from historical bridge closures, causes big losses for local businesses, especially in the High Street. Also local businesses are struggling to recruit staff, especially in the hospitality sector, so the very small amount of jobs potentially available for local people, would only complete with the resources available. The only people to gain from this inappropriate development, in our precious green open spaces, are the already wealthy developers, at huge expense to the residents of Westhorpe Park.

There are 56 low cost homes at Westhorpe Park, many of whom are elderly and vulnerable. We live here for the peace and quiet that the area provides and many people have lived here for over 25 years. We have a lovely community that provides a vital support network to those who need it. For the last 18 months, we have faced a constant barrage of harassment, threats and lies from the developers, which has already taken its toll on our health and caused unnecessary stress and upset. And that's all before a decision has been made regarding the application. Some people have tried to sell their properties, but with no success while the threat hangs over us. If the application gets approved, we will simply not be able to sell, so cannot move. None of us can afford to walk away from our homes to live somewhere else, especially not in our support network area. Effectively we will be trapped living in the middle of a huge, noisy, 90 acre industrial estate, that after years of construction, will operate 24 hours a day. Be under no illusion that the detrimental impact on our wellbeing will be huge and lifechanging. Physically the ability for the daily carers, ambulance drivers, hospital transport, hot meals, etc. to gain the required immediate access, will cause physical suffering for many.

The support MTC have shown, to make a few wealthy individuals even wealthier, at the expense of so many individuals is incredible sad. It feels like you have just banged more nails into our coffins. If your parents lived here, would you be supporting such a project that causes so much suffering?

Dear Councillors

I am writing to complain about the actions of Marlow Town Council in relation to the proposed film studio planning application.

As a resident of the Little Marlow Parish, I shall leave it to the Marlow Town residents to take up the issue of the letter submitted to the Bucks Council Planning Authority by Cllr Richard Scott and the appropriateness of how the decision to publicly support the above planning application

was conducted. However I feel I must inform you of the anger and disappointment felt by many of the residents of Westhorpe Park, for the total lack of consideration and compassion by the members of Marlow Town Council, as we face such a devasting loss of quality of life, as a direct result of the project.

It is my understanding that Councillors have had multiple meetings with the representatives from Dido Property Ltd, despite refusing to engage with local residents who are the most knowledgeable and familiar with the area and people under threat. Sadly it appears MTC have been persuaded by the developers to believe the unsubstantiated claims, unachievable goals and hollow wish list promoted in the extensive PR campaign. The fact that the developers have spent to much time and money on such an extensive PR campaign, just to try and convince people the project is a good idea, should in itself ring very loud alarm bells.

Whilst some Councillors believe the development my bring extra financial benefit for the local community, other than CIL and rates for the local authority, it would be highly unlikely to benefit the community, bringing traffic chaos, which we know from historical bridge closures, causes big losses for local businesses, especially in the High Street. Also local businesses are struggling to recruit staff, especially in the hospitality sector, so the very small amount of jobs potentially available for local people, would only complete with the resources available. The only people to gain from this inappropriate development, in our precious green open spaces, are the already wealthy developers, at huge expense to the residents of Westhorpe Park.

There are 56 low cost homes at Westhorpe Park, many of whom are elderly and vulnerable. We live here for the peace and quiet that the area provides and many people have lived here for over 25 years. We have a lovely community that provides a vital support network to those who need it. For the last 18 months, we have faced a constant barrage of harassment, threats and lies from the developers, which has already taken its toll on our health and caused unnecessary stress and upset. And that's all before a decision has been made regarding the application. Some people have tried to sell their properties, but with no success while the threat hangs over us. If the application gets approved, we will simply not be able to sell, so cannot move. None of us can afford to walk away from our homes to live somewhere else, especially not in our support network area. Effectively we will be trapped living in the middle of a huge, noisy, 90 acre industrial estate, that after years of construction, will operate 24 hours a day. Be under no illusion that the detrimental impact on our wellbeing will be huge and lifechanging. Physically the ability for the daily carers, ambulance drivers, hospital transport, hot meals, etc. to gain the required immediate access, will cause physical suffering for many.

The support MTC have shown, to make a few wealthy individuals even wealthier, at the expense of so many individuals is incredible sad. It feels like you have just banged more nails into our coffins. If your parents lived here, would you be supporting such a project that causes so much suffering?

The comments made on behalf of the council do not mention any concerns or possible negative impacts of the scheme on the town. Were none really raised at the meeting? Also Mr Scott mentions the 2:1 support for the scheme based on submissions to the Buckinghamshire Council website which it is stated aligns with the messaging from Marlow residents. Can you advise please what data the 2:1 support from Marlow residents is based on?

As my local councillor I'd be interested to understand more about your own views. I see that you declared yourself to be neutral on the matter. I assume that this is not due to any conflict with your but is because given the balance of the arguments you are not persuaded either way? If so can you tell me what you see as the likely positive impacts and the likely negative impacts if the development were to go ahead?

My personal view is that the studio plan should be rejected. I think that the prime objective of the proposers is their own financial gain (via their Guernsey based company), with very little commercial likely benefit likely for the town but with traffic congestion increasing and air quality decreasing - in addition to the loss of green belt land.

Also, given its importance I couldn't find any mention of the film studios in recent edition of the Marlovian. The top item in the town council news being new litter bins in the High Street; surely the studio application is of greater significance to residents?

Can I suggest that the council convenes a public meeting to fully explain its position and to get input from local residents. It could then follow this with a formal council meeting, providing the opportunity to reconsider its position in light of the debate.

I'd be interested in your views.



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

The full rules for Parish meetings are attached again. BALC's advice from and the NALC state is pasted below.

Did you have an annual parish meeting between 1st March and 1st June? After that the Parish Council has no further requirement to call a meeting of the parish because it has discharged it's duty. Thereafter, because you are a parish council, you are not obliged to call any more meetings of the parish, it is envisaged that the electorate will engage with the council at the predetermined meetings.

Whilst the parish may lobby for action, they cannot bind the council to a decision, nor can councillors agree one. It is likely only the Chair of the Council will be there, that other councillors may decline to be present it would seem that a meeting of the kind proposed would not provide the outcome people would hope for. You only need two councillors for quoracy. There would also be the minimum requirement of 7 clear days notice.

If the meeting of the parish is being called in order to establish a demand for a poll, then check the outline in 10.9 in my 11th edition of CAB. Be mindful of the timing, the fact that it will not change the material consideration of a planning application and that the parish council will have to pay for it. It will be subject to the rules on notice and availability as for a councillor election.

Given the passions involved you might want to call an informal town meeting, explain the situation and the role of the town council in the process of planning applications.

I understand, entirely from heresay that there may have been a decision made at an incorrectly called meeting, if that had happened then of course the decision would be ultra vires and that decision would need to properly heard and resolved at the next available formal meeting.

The NALC has initially drawn reference to the legislation as below. BALC will respond to us again with further advice tomorrow.

Paragraph 9 of Schedule 12 to the Local Government Act 1972 deals with the calling of extraordinary parish council meetings. They can be called at any time by the chair or, in accordance with paragraph 9 (2), by two members. Paragraph 15 of Schedule 12 sets out who can convene a Parish Meeting and that can be by six electors.







Thanks for the call earlier. A few pointers re: the parish meeting/parish poll issue. This information is being provide in confidence to you and, as we said on the phone, is not legal advice to the parish council. I'll give you a call at 10 am.

Convening: yes a parish meeting can be called/convened by 6 electors; it's the convenors who have to issue the notice (time and place and business) and agenda and sign it.

Minimum notice of parish meeting: normally a minimum notice of 7 clear days is needed Council/Parish Meeting: a parish meeting is entirely separate from a parish/town council except that, if present, the chairman of the council has to preside (indeed the chairman has a right to attend)

Quorum: two electors

Decisions: taken by the majority of those electors present and voting. Voting doesn't have to follow any particular format (unlike council meetings) so a show of hands is ok or by voice

Poll: this has to be "demanded" by the parish meeting – and must be demanded not later than the end of the meeting in question; it must be proposed and seconded; the wording has to be clear and the proposition must be capable of a Yes or No answer so that if a poll is agreed upon, it can be voted on by the wider electorate in a Yes or No way


Number required to demand a poll: ten electors or a third of those electors present must demand it; no vote is taken on <u>whether</u> the poll should happen; only on the actual wording of the proposition – that wording is what would appear on the ballot paper when the poll takes place

Subject of the poll: it should relate to "parish/town affairs" (not issues that affect all parishes equally); and as the cost of the poll is born by the parish/town council, the object of the poll should be something that the parish council could actually do (if it wishes to)

Procedure after poll determined: chairman of the meeting must immediately notify the Returning Officer who will arrange for the poll to be held; the name and address of the proposer should be supplied to the Returning Officer by the chairman. Poll must be held within 14 and 25 days of the passing of the resolution. The notice of poll—including details of the question to be asked—must be given not less than 5 working days before the poll. Poll will be held on the relevant day between 1600 hours and 2100 hours. Some normal rules of ballots don't apply: only in person voting is possible; no poll cards issued etc.

Effect of the poll vote—not binding: if the proposition requests the parish/town council to do something then the outcome is not binding on the parish/town council (except where the resolution asks the council to provide allotments) and it can't be enforced Costs: of arranging the poll fall to the parish/town council

I am writing to complain about the actions of Marlow Town Council in relation to the proposed film studio planning application.

As a resident of the Little Marlow Parish, I shall leave it to the Marlow Town residents to take up the issue of the letter submitted to the Bucks Council Planning Authority by Cllr Richard Scott and the appropriateness of how the decision to publicly support the above planning application was conducted. However I feel I must inform you of the anger and disappointment felt by many of the residents of Westhorpe Park, for the total lack of consideration and compassion by the members of Marlow Town Council, as we face such a devasting loss of quality of life, as a direct result of the project.

It is my understanding that Councillors have had multiple meetings with the representatives from Dido Property Ltd, despite refusing to engage with local residents who are the most knowledgeable and familiar with the area and people under threat. Sadly it appears MTC have been persuaded by the developers to believe the unsubstantiated claims, unachievable goals and hollow wish list promoted in the extensive PR campaign. The fact that the developers have

spent to much time and money on such an extensive PR campaign, just to try and convince people the project is a good idea, should in itself ring very loud alarm bells.

Whilst some Councillors believe the development my bring extra financial benefit for the local community, other than CIL and rates for the local authority, it would be highly unlikely to benefit the community, bringing traffic chaos, which we know from historical bridge closures, causes big losses for local businesses, especially in the High Street. Also local businesses are struggling to recruit staff, especially in the hospitality sector, so the very small amount of jobs potentially available for local people, would only complete with the resources available. The only people to gain from this inappropriate development, in our precious green open spaces, are the already wealthy developers, at huge expense to the residents of Westhorpe Park.

There are 56 low cost homes at Westhorpe Park, many of whom are elderly and vulnerable. We live here for the peace and quiet that the area provides and many people have lived here for over 25 years. We have a lovely community that provides a vital support network to those who need it. For the last 18 months, we have faced a constant barrage of harassment, threats and lies from the developers, which has already taken its toll on our health and caused unnecessary stress and upset. And that's all before a decision has been made regarding the application. Some people have tried to sell their properties, but with no success while the threat hangs over us. If the application gets approved, we will simply not be able to sell, so cannot move. None of us can afford to walk away from our homes to live somewhere else, especially not in our support network area. Effectively we will be trapped living in the middle of a huge, noisy, 90 acre industrial estate, that after years of construction, will operate 24 hours a day. Be under no illusion that the detrimental impact on our wellbeing will be huge and lifechanging. Physically the ability for the daily carers, ambulance drivers, hospital transport, hot meals, etc. to gain the required immediate access, will cause physical suffering for many.

The support MTC have shown, to make a few wealthy individuals even wealthier, at the expense of so many individuals is incredible sad. It feels like you have just banged more nails into our coffins. If your parents lived here, would you be supporting such a project that causes so much suffering?

Please see attached legal topic note on Parish Meetings. I have spoken with BALC again today and we both agree that Council would be better placed to call an informal public meeting for an open forum on the film studio rather than accede to the parish Meeting request from the 12 electorate. This would allow residents to air their views in a public forum but as already advised Council has no legal obligation to act on them. Standing Orders can be used for the rules of debate at either type of meeting with the exception that only the electorate of the Parish are able to ask questions at a Parish Meeting. Members are free to choose which way to proceed.

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

There is nothing we can currently locate that determines a time frame for having the meeting other than 7 days clear notice must be given. BALC have referred the matter to the at NALC. The NALC has initially drawn reference to the legislation as below. BALC will respond to us again with further advice tomorrow.

Paragraph 9 of Schedule 12 to the Local Government Act 1972 deals with the calling of extraordinary parish council meetings. They can be called at any time by the chair or, in accordance with paragraph 9 (2), by two members. Paragraph 15 of Schedule 12 sets out who can convene a Parish Meeting and that can be by six electors.

I am writing to express my concerns about the approach taken by Marlow Town Council in its consideration of the Marlow Film Studio project.

For a matter of such importance can you please help me understand why:

- 1. The matter was discussed at a members-only meeting, not a formal meeting of the council with a clerk present?
- The comment was submitted by, Richard Scott, classifying as a "member of the public" although then putting in the text that it was relaying the views of Marlow Town Council. Perhaps it would have been better submitted by the leader of the council under "Other Interested Parties"

The comments made on behalf of the council do not mention any concerns or possible negative impacts of the scheme on the town. Were none really raised at the meeting? Also Mr Scott mentions the 2:1 support for the scheme based on submissions to the Buckinghamshire Council website which it is stated aligns with the messaging from Marlow residents. Can you advise please what data the 2:1 support from Marlow residents is based on?

As my local councillor I'd be interested to understand more about your own views. I see that you declared yourself to be neutral on the matter. I assume that this is not due to any conflict with your role on Buckinghamshire Council, but is because given the balance of the arguments you are not persuaded either way? If so can you tell me what you see as the likely positive impacts and the likely negative impacts if the development were to go ahead?

My personal view is that the studio plan should be rejected. I think that the prime objective of the proposers is their own financial gain (via their Guernsey based company), with very little commercial likely benefit likely for the town but with traffic congestion increasing and air quality decreasing - in addition to the loss of green belt land.

Also, given its importance I couldn't find any mention of the film studios in recent edition of the Marlovian. The top item in the town council news being new litter bins in the High Street; surely the studio application is of greater significance to residents?

Can I suggest that the council convenes a public meeting to fully explain its position and to get input from local residents. It could then follow this with a formal council meeting, providing the opportunity to reconsider its position in light of the debate.

I'd be interested in your views.
