And all those who took part in today's Ceremony of Remembrance

Today we are here to remember the dead of the Armed Forces and all those who have died as a result of war and conflict.

The Poppy, as a symbol of Remembrance, had its centenary last year. A Frenchwoman called Anna Guérin who was inspired by a Canadian Army Surgeon Lt Col John McCrae's poem "In Flanders Field" which was published in 1915 (and is reproduced at the end of this Service sheet). She thought the idea of adopting the poppy as a symbol of Remembrance and hope for a peaceful future could catch on.

An American lady called Moina Michael was also impressed and was responsible for the introduction of the Poppy to the USA. Madame Guérin took the idea to Canada and the UK, six weeks before the first Remembrance Day Service which was due to be held on 11th November 1921. She took her idea to the Legion who were initially sceptical but took up her offer to make a million poppies in France at her own expense for distribution on Remembrance Day in the UK. A further 8 million were ordered to be produced in Britain. The Legion's National President, Earl Haig, declared that it should become an annual feature. The Poppy has enabled the Royal British Legion to raise funds to enable it to fulfil its caring, campaigning and Remembrance roles ever since.

Although the fallen of World War 1 and 2 have tended to predominate there have been many operations and or conflicts since 1945. To name the locations where there has been the heaviest loss of life, Palestine; Malaya; Korea; Egypt; Cyprus; Northern Ireland; Falklands; Afghanistan and Iraq. It is essential that all those that have fallen since the end of WW2 are not forgotten. The total number of fallen is in the order of 7190. There have only been 3 years during this period that a British Service person has not made the ultimate sacrifice whilst on operations – they are 1968, 2016 and 2023.

The sacrifices that have been made by our forces and those of our allies have enabled the freedoms which are essential for a civilised society and which we have been able to enjoy.

However, on Remembrance Sunday we must not only remember those that fell but also those that have lost loved ones and the civilian populations that have been directly affected by conflicts. Moreover, we must also remember all those that have been injured in body or mind and those who are yet to suffer from the events they have experienced or witnessed.

Let us continue to wear the poppy with pride and remember the debt we all owe to so many:

Greater love has no man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends. John 15:13
