Welcome to the Winter 2025 magazine

s I sit down to write this, I can't believe how quickly the months have flown by. My mayoral role continues to be a true privilege, and I am doing my utmost to accept every invitation I receive. We have been treated to a particularly beautiful autumn this year and against this lovely backdrop, the last few months have been full of memorable moments, and I would like to share just a few highlights.

In September, Marlow Town Council joined the Green Village at Marlow Carnival. It proved to be a delightful day, full of conker playing and conversations with residents about sustainability, their interest in the Local Plan and what they would like to see in the High Street phone boxes. Having experienced firsthand the therapeutic value of being in the fresh air, and growing food in the company of others, I was invited to join the horticultural therapy group at Hanging Hill allotments to discuss the positives of community gardening. Some of us also attended the Allotment AGM, precious assets for Marlow residents.

The General Manager of The Britannia invited me to their Macmillan Coffee Morning and while there, I learned about their wonderful community initiative: a community coffee afternoon from 4pm – 6pm on the second Monday of every month, providing a free hot drink, a slice of cake or a biscuit, and, more importantly, some friendly chat. I am told these afternoons are very well attended by our seniors, and I am delighted to see such care for community wellbeing.

Roots & Shoots Awards

Spinfield School wins award from the Dr. Jane Goodall Institute



pinfield School has been named a winner of the Jane Goodall's Roots & Shoots Awards 2025, in the Roots & Shoots Journey and Legacy - Your Story category. The judges praised the school's inspiring story of teamwork and growth, highlighting how it integrates environmental care, community service, and compassion for animals into everyday school life. They said Spinfield's approach exemplifies how young people can make a meaningful impact on the world around them. Judges also commended the pupils' creativity, collaboration, and impressive project outcomes, calling the recognition "well-deserved for everyone involved." Thanks to the generosity of the Roots & Shoots programme sponsors, Spinfield Primary School has received a £500 prize to support its next sustainability initiative. The school will also be presented with a Roots & Shoots trophy and a collection of special prizes. The judges remarked that Spinfield's story continues Dr. Jane Goodall's legacy of hope and action, and expressed their excitement to share it more widely.

A journey rooted in sustainability _

Before joining Roots & Shoots, Spinfield School had already established a strong foundation in sustainability through several initiatives, including the British Council International School Award, Surfers Against Sewage Plastic Free Schools, the Woodland Trust, and the Fairtrade Schools Association. Becoming part of the Roots & Shoots community allowed the school to unify these efforts under a single, cohesive vision — giving pupils a stronger sense of purpose, global awareness, and environmental responsibility.

*Highlights of the school's work*____

Little Rotters Composting Group – Pupils manage composting across the school, learning about food waste reduction and the natural cycle of life.

Bug Hotels – Children designed and built habitats to boost biodiversity and encourage outdoor learning.

Fairtrade Cupcake Competition – 53 pupils baked cakes using Fairtrade ingredients, showing creativity and commitment to ethical sourcing. The cakes were shared with a local care home, connecting global and local acts of kindness.



Foodbank Support – Through collaboration with One Can Trust, pupils organised food donations for families in need.

Chimpanzee Sponsorship – Pupils raised £150 by selling a Fairtrade cupcake recipe book, sponsoring three chimpanzees in support of Jane Goodall's mission.

Waste-Free Wednesday – Weekly tallies of plastic-free lunchboxes encourage a reduction in single-use plastics.

Sustainability Pledges – Families across the school community committed to eco-friendly pledges at home.

Recognition and community impact_

Spinfield's achievements have been celebrated on the Roots & Shoots Mission Updates page and were posted in the 2025 end-of-year Roots & Shoots newsletter as the featured school. In July 2025, Spinfield hosted the Roots & Shoots team for an engaging workshop with two classes - an event that inspired pupils and reinforced their passion for sustainability. The Roots & Shoots programme has empowered pupils to become leaders in sustainability and global citizenship, fostering teamwork, creativity, and compassion throughout the school community.

Looking ahead_

Spinfield's newly elected Global Citizens Committee is preparing to launch new initiatives in 2026, continuing the school's commitment to improving life for people, animals and the planet.

Spinfield's Roots & Shoots journey demonstrates how young people can be powerful changemakers. The school is proud of its pupils' passion, dedication, and ability to create real-world impact - a testament to what can be achieved when a community unites behind a shared vision for a better future.



Consider investing in a new heat pump



Wo years ago, a couple who live in a bungalow in Marlow, decided to replace their aging condensing gas boiler to reduce their carbon footprint. During the two years of researching and investigating the purchase of a heat pump to warm their house and heat their water, they contacted 12 companies and had 12 visits and subsequent quotations varying from around £12,000 to over £19,000. However, as the Government's Boiler Upgrade Scheme (BUS) provides grants of £7,500 to reduce the overall cost, they decided to spend £5,700 to purchase a Vaillant Arotherm plus 7KW heat pump.

Their chosen supplier installed their heat pump and ensured that their four thermal panels (water) and their 16 photo-voltaic (PV, Electricity) panels were incorporated into the system. As some existing pipework and radiators had to be replaced, the thermal panel had to be linked to the new hot water cylinder and their PV panels were connected to provide some of the power to the heat pump, the installation took four days. Their house is now warm all through the day and night and the water for their showers is hot.

This year they purchased a 6kwh battery at a cost of £2,325 from a supplier in Marlow. In conjunction with their electricity supplier (Octopus), they now charge their battery, either using Octopus's cheap rates (4am to 7am, 1pm to 4pm and 10pm until mid-night), or from their PV panels on sunny days. Their battery (see photo of the battery and the PV Inverter) provides them with power during a good deal of the day and evenings.

Although a new gas boiler will cost between £2,000 and £4,000, they contribute significantly to adverse climate change. So, if you have to replace an aging gas boiler, or if you have some spare cash, consider buying a new heat pump, which is likely to save you money and reduce your carbon emissions and hopefully protect future generations.

Wild Marlow

Helping Marlow's hedgehogs through the winter



s temperatures start to drop this winter, hedgehogs will be searching for cozy places to hibernate in our gardens. Whether your garden is naturally wild or more formal, there are some easy and effective ways to improve your garden for hedgehogs. Our gardens are fundamental for the survival of our urban hedgehog population. The State of Britain's Hedgehogs Report 2022 reveals a decline of 30-75% since 2000 but it has also showed that urban hedgehog populations appear to have stabilised. Connections between gardens act as safe highways for hedgehogs and the simple concept of leaving a gap in fences has been very effective for the Hedgehog Highways project.

A natural pile of logs and brash with a ground-level opening makes a perfect shelter for our prickly companions. It could be the chosen site for hibernation and even more magical would be a nesting site for a female in the summer months. If you have a formal garden then tucking a wooden hedgehog house in a quiet, sheltered spot will still be a good option for hedgehogs.

Wilder gardens support more invertebrates, which are vital for a hedgehog's diet. Increased use of pesticides and slug repellents has meant that it is not so simple for hedgehogs to find a tasty meal. Please stop the use of these toxic chemicals! As cold temperatures cause puddles and ponds to freeze, it's important to keep a shallow water dish regularly defrosted with hot water for the hedgehogs. Although they hibernate, they are known to periodically rouse from sleep and a water source is vital

Please create these fantastic connected highways through gardens to ensure a diverse buffet of food, offer those sheltered spots and maintain a water source to help our hedgehog populations thrive in Marlow.

Follow The Donkey

Explore the story of the Marlow Donkey by rail and on foot

new community project was launched on the 12th August bringing local history to life in Marlow and Bourne End. The project, 'Follow the Donkey', celebrates the heritage and local environment of the Marlow / Bourne End railway line - which is affectionately known by locals as the Marlow Donkey.

With funding from Great Western Railway's (GWR) Customer and Community Improvement Fund and supported by Buckinghamshire Council's Culture Development Team, the scheme has worked with community partners and groups to explore and celebrate the history of the railway, whilst promoting a popular riverside walking trail which links the stations.



Earlier this summer, creative workshops were held with community groups and local residents to explore the story of the Marlow Donkey, strengthen community connections, and contribute to a local exhibition. These workshops also helped shape the design of the walking trail information and heritage boards.

The trail and heritage boards were unveiled by the Chairman of Buckinghamshire Council on the 12th August with a celebration at Bourne End station, where there were family-friendly activities, provided by Marlow Museum and Wooburn & Bourne End Parish Council, along with history talks and complementary refreshments.



The artwork and poetry produced at the community workshops have been curated into a colourful collage which has been on display at Marlow and Bourne End libraries and will be moving to Marlow Museum following the launch event.





MTC and Red Kite joined together to listen to resident queries

arlow Town Council and Red Kite held a joint 'open surgery' for resident queries on Saturday, 27th September on the Gunthorpe Road estate.

Councillors Jenny Simnett and Emma Hawkins of Marlow Town Council were joined by Red Kite staff from their community engagement and property management staff. The event was attended by over 50 estate residents and supported by Councillors Olwen Elliott, Anna Crabtree and Alex Collingwood, the latter two representing Bucks Council.

The issues raised spanned queries about the approved planning proposals, parking, fly tipping, extra and relocated bins, anti-social behaviour, flooding garages, repainting white parking lines and individual property repairs. Red Kite has removed most of the fly tipped rubbish and cleared some of the overgrown footpaths. All the issues raised have been progressed and we are endeavouring to feedback action taken to individual residents where appropriate or via the Gunthorpe Road estate Facebook page.

We have shared some resident queries about the two approved planning proposals in Westhorpe Road and Shelley Road. It has been highlighted to Red Kite the need to engage with residents in person and answer residents' concerns about parking capacity and disruption during construction.




